City of Camanche April 18, 2023

The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa met in regular session April 18, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. at Camanche City Hall. Present on roll call: Mayor Pro Tem Paul Varner presiding, and Council members Bowman and Weller. Absent: Mayor Pruett and Council members Determann and Schnoor. Also present were City Attorneys Randy Current, John Frey and Braydon Roberts, City Administrator Andrew Kida and Department Heads Evans, Pewe, Schmitz, Schutte and Schneider.

A moment of silent prayer was observed. Mayor Pro Tem Varner led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilman Bowman asked to have New Business Items #2 and #3, Resolution to hire Police Officer and Oath of Office, placed at the beginning of the meeting. Moved by Councilman Bowman second by Councilman Varner, to approve the agenda, as amended. On roll call — all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Weller to Adopt a Resolution to Approve Hiring Police Officer 3rd Class for the Police Department of the City of Camanche, Iowa. On roll call — all Ayes.

Mayor Pro Tem Varner administered the Oath of Office for Officer 3rd Class Joe Tyson.

Visitor Joe Vens presented an overview of the City's insurance policy and coverage to the Council. He explained that our premiums are up approximately 15% while other cities have seen premium increases from 15-40%. He said they looked at valuations this year to make sure limits are proper. Councilman Bowman asked about the Medical Expense Liability premium increase from \$5,000 to \$50,000; Vens said it was just a type-o. Bowman also noted the Linebacker current renewal is blank; Vens said there is no change. Vens also brought up Cyber Coverage. He recommends looking into enhanced coverage instead of what EMC offers. Councilmen Bowman and Varner think this is a good idea. Kida will check with the City's IT provider to see what coverage is provided by their service. Chief Schmitz said the Police Department uses the County IT.

Mayor Pro Tem Varner called for public comments on Agenda topics. There were none.

Dan Lawlor and Nitesh with ABM presented their Preliminary Needs Assessment Review after visiting the city facilities and collecting data from City Staff. Their report is available on the City website in the Public Packet for the 04-18-23 meeting.

Public Works Director Pewe gave an update on PFAS and Well #5. He said the generator is running 12 hours per day. We are having a minor sulfur odor issue in a few areas. Chlorine is being slowly adjusted to solve this issue.

Under New Business, City Administrator Kida asked to table Item #1, First Reading of An Ordinance Amendment to Chapter 6-13 Physical Environment – Flood Plain Management.

Two bids were received for the sale of the used Fire Department Ladder truck: \$3,000 Justin Morris, and \$4,560 Chris Lazen. Kida said it is up to Council whether to accept the highest bid or reject both bids. Councilman Varner asked for Chief Schutte's thoughts. Chief Schutte said the bids were less than what he expected. If these bids are rejected, there are a couple of options. Further discussion ensued.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Bowman to reject the two bids received. On roll call – all Ayes.

Chief Schutte presented the Camanche Fire Department March 2023 Report and Chief Schmitz presented the Camanche Police Department March 2023 Report.

Kida informed Council that Milestones eliminated the senior meal site due to lack of participation. Individuals can still sign up for home delivery. He said there was a 28E meeting with the City of Clinton yesterday, an annual meeting regarding the sanitary sewer. Our flow rates have increased from 5% to 5.2% and we may now be talking about our funding situation. He also said we are staffed, ready and planned out for the flood, with a crest of 22' expected early next week. Pewe said his department is getting sand and has a pallet of sandbags. The setup will be the same as last year at the high school. He reported that he received a surprise phone call. The Public Works truck is on the lot but the specs are not what he expected so he will be doing more checking. Chief Schutte said the Ambulance Billing service we currently use

will be retiring so he will be getting bids from other services. He is also trying to find funding for a side-by-side or UTV for Public Safety.

Kida added that we would like to discourage the public from trying to access the flooded areas for everyone's safety. Please stay out of areas where there are road closed signs posted to allow our City and Public Safety personnel do their jobs.

Mayor Pro Tem Varner called for Public Comments. There were none.

Mayor Pro Tem Varner adjourned the meeting at 7:00 p.m.

ORDINANCE	

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6-13-2, 6-13-3, 6-13-4 AND 6-13-8 PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT: FLOOD PLAIN MANAGEMENT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMANCHE, IOWA:

Section 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this ordinance is to amend the current City of Camanche flood plain ordinance to reflect necessary changes as directed by FEMA and the Iowa Department of Natural Resources.

Section 2. Facts Found. The City Council hereby makes the following findings of fact:

- 1) The City of Camanche, Iowa currently has a Flood Plain Management ordinance
- 2) Iowa DNR and FEMA have made changes to the guidelines and requirements for ordinances in order for residents within the floodplain areas of the City to purchase flood insurance
- 3) The City of Camanche, Iowa deems the changes to be necessary
- 4) A full copy of the ordinance with changes highlighted shall be available for inspection at the Camanche City Hall and on the City of Camanche website at www.camancheia.org/documentcenter/ordinances-and-code

Section 3. <u>Amendment</u>. The Camanche, Iowa, Code of Ordinances is hereby amended in summary as follows:

Amend 6-13-2 (1) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following language in lieu thereof:

1. Lands to Which Ordinance Apply

The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to all lands and development which have significant flood hazards. The Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) for Clinton County and Incorporated Areas, City of Camanche, Panels 19045C0484F, dated July 19, 2023, Panels 19045C0483E, 0487E, 0489E, 0491E, 0492E, 0493E, 0494E, 0513E, dated July 22, 2020 and Panel 19045C00511E, date November 4, 2016 which were prepared as part of the Clinton County Flood Insurance Study, shall be used to identify such flood hazard areas and all areas shown thereon to be within the boundaries of the base flood shall be considered as having significant flood hazards. The Flood Insurance Study for the County of Clinton is hereby adopted by reference and is made a part of this ordinance for the purpose of administering floodplain management regulations.

Amend 6-13-3 (1) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following language in lieu thereof:

1. All development must be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage and meet the following applicable performance standards. Where base flood elevations have not been provided in the Flood Insurance Study, the Iowa Department of Natural Resources shall be contacted to determine (i) whether the land involved is either wholly or partly within the floodway or floodway fringe and (ii) the base flood elevation. Until a regulatory floodway is designated, no development may increase the Base Flood Elevation more than one (1) foot. The applicant will be responsible for

providing the Department of Natural Resources with sufficient technical information to make such determination.

Amend 6-13-3 (1) (a) (1) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following language in lieu thereof:

1. Be designed and adequately anchored to prevent flotation, collapse or lateral movement.

Amend 6-13-3 (1) (d) (3) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following language in lieu thereof:

3. New and substantially improved structures shall be constructed with electric meter, electrical service panel box, hot water heater, heating, air conditioning, ventilation equipment (including ductwork), and other similar machinery and equipment elevated (or in the case on non-residential structures, optionally flood-proofed to) a minimum of one (1) foot above the base flood elevation.

Amend 6-13-3-(1) (d) by incorporating the following provision

4. New and substantially improved structures shall be constructed with plumbing, gas lines, water/gas meters and other similar service utilities either elevated (or in the case of non-residential structures, optionally flood-proofed to) a minimum of one (1) foot above the base flood elevation or designed to be watertight and withstand inundation to such a level.

Amend 6-13-3 (1) (I) (1) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following language in lieu thereof:

1. Recreational vehicles are exempt from the requirements of 6-13-1 (1) (E) of this Ordinance regarding anchoring and elevation of factory-built homes when the following criteria are satisfied:

Amend 6-13-3 (1) (I) (2) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following in lieu thereof:

2. Recreational vehicles that are located on the site for more than 180 consecutive days or are not ready for highway use must satisfy requirements of 6-13-1 (1) (E) of this Ordinance regarding anchoring and elevation of factory-built homes.

Amend the first sentence of 6-13-3 (2) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following in lieu thereof:

In addition to the General Floodplain Standards, development within the floodway must meet the following applicable standards.

Amend the first sentence of 6-13-3 (2) (a) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following in lieu thereof:

a. No development shall be permitted in the floodway that would result in any increase in the base flood elevation. Consideration of the effects of any development on flood levels shall be based upon the assumption that an equal degree of development would be allowed for similarly situated lands.

Amend 6-13-3 (2) (d) by deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following in lieu thereof:

d. Structures, buildings, recreational vehicles, and sanitary and utility systems, if permitted, shall meet the applicable General Floodplain standards and shall be constructed or aligned to present the minimum possible resistance to flood flows.

Amend 6-13-3 (2) (e) be deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following in lieu thereof:

e. Structures, if permitted, shall have a low flood damage potential and shall not be for human habitation.

Amend 6-13-4 (1) (b) by incorporating the following provisions:

- 8. Notify the Federal Insurance Administrator of any annexations or modifications to the community's boundaries.
- 9. Review subdivision proposals to ensure such proposals are consistent with the purpose of this ordinance and advise the public of potential conflict.

Amend 6-13-4 (2) (a) be deleting it in its entirety and replace with the following in lieu thereof:

a. Permit Required - A Floodplain Development Permit issued by the Administrator shall be secured prior to any floodplain development (any man-made change to improved and unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, mining, filling, grading, paving, storage of materials and equipment, excavation or drilling operations), including the placement of factory-built homes.

Amend 601304 (2) (b) by incorporating the following provision:

- 8. Location and dimensions of all structures and additions
- 6-13-8 by deleting item 18 in its entirety and replacing it with the following in lieu thereof:
- 18. ENCLOSED AREA BELOW LOWEST FLOOR The floor of the lowest enclosed area in a building when <u>all</u> the following criteria are met:
 - A. The enclosed area is designed to flood to equalize hydrostatic pressure during flood events with walls or openings that satisfy the provisions of 6-13-3 (1) (d) (1) of this Ordinance, and
 - B. The enclosed area is unfinished (not carpeted, drywalled, etc.) and used solely for low damage potential uses such as building access, parking or storage, and
 - C. Machinery and service facilities (e.g., hot water heater, furnace, electrical service) contained in the enclosed area are located at least one (1) foot above the base flood elevation, and
 - D. The enclosed area is not a "basement" as defined in this section.

This Waterline Connection Agreement (this "Agreement") is entered into on this___ day of______, 2023, by and among Chevron Environmental Management Company, a California corporation ("Chevron"), for itself and as Attorney-in-Fact for ACC Chemical Company ("ACC"), a Delaware corporation, and Getty Chemical Company ("GCC"), a Delaware corporation; Citigroup Inc., a Delaware corporation ("Citigroup"); the City of Camanche, Iowa (the "City"); and the undersigned landowner or landowners of 3614 9th Street, Camanche, Iowa 52730, and 3616 9th Street, Camanche, Iowa 52730 (collectively, and jointly and severally in the case of multiple persons, the "Owner"). Chevron, ACC, GCC and Citigroup are referred to herein collectively as the "Companies."

Recitals

The City owns and operates a potable water system which includes several wells, a water tower and a distribution system to serve its population. The portion of the City located west of U.S. Highway 67 (the "Western Area") contains several homes, which still obtain potable water through individual private wells.

In 2010, the City completed construction of new water storage towers and water lines (the "New Lines") to serve the Western Area (the "Project"), and the Companies funded the Project. To date, the City has operated and maintained the water system. Owner will become a City water system customer. The Owner owns real property located in or adjacent to the Western Area (the "Property"). As part of the Project, the City will construct a water service line from the New Lines to a designated point of connection on the Property to supply potable water in place of the Owner's current private potable water supply well or wells.

The City will connect the Property to the New Lines if the Owner agrees to allow abandonment of the Owner's water supply well or wells existing on the day this Agreement is signed by the Parties (the "Existing Wells"), causing the Existing Wells to be formally abandoned, capped, and taken out of service pursuant to all applicable federal and state regulations (collectively, the "Abandonment Regulations"), and agrees not to construct any additional water supply wells or to reuse the Existing Wells at any time in the future. The Owner desires to be served by the New Lines, and the City is willing to connect the Property with the New Lines by means of a new service line and appurtenances, on the terms set forth in this Agreement. In exchange for the Owner's and the City's willingness to enter into this Agreement, the Companies are willing to pay the Owner the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for each residential structure on the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

1. **Water Supply**. As part of the Project, the City will provide a service line to connect each residence on the Property that is presently supplied water by the Existing Wells to the New Lines. The point of connection of the new service line to each residence will be made where the discharge piping from the Existing Wells reaches the residence. Construction details for the service

line(s) such as diameter, material, flow metering, pressure reducing valves, and other appurtenances will be determined by City's engineering consultant. Once the service line connection is complete, the City will supply water to the Owner on the same basis and at the standard rates for users of the City's water system. After the service line is placed into service, Owner will be responsible for maintaining the service line and appurtenances located on Owner's Property.

- Well Abandonment. Upon City's connection of the Property to the New Lines, Owner shall allow the Companies to abandon, cap, and permanently take the Existing Wells out of service in accordance with the Abandonment Regulations.
- 3. **Cash Payment**. Within sixty days following the connection of the Property to the New Lines, the Companies shall pay to the Owner the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00).
- 4. **Continued Non-Use**. From and after the date the Property is connected to the New Lines, the Owner hereby covenants and agrees that the Owner (1) shall cease all use of the Existing Wells and (2) shall at no time in the future construct, or permit any other person to construct, another water supply well on the Property.
- 5. Access. Owner shall grant access to the City to install and test the service line connection(s) and appurtenances. Owner shall also grant access to the Companies to abandon the Existing Wells.
- 6. **Representations and Warranties**. The City and the Companies hereby represent and warrant that each of them has full power and authority to execute, deliver and perform its obligations pursuant to this Agreement and that all action necessary for authorization, execution, delivery and performance by such party has been duly taken. The Owner hereby represents and warrants that the Owner, and each individual comprising the Owner, has full power and authority to execute, deliver, and perform the Owner's obligations pursuant to this Agreement and that all action necessary for authorization, execution, delivery and performance by such party has been duly taken. The Owner further represents and warrants that, if any person comprising the Owner is married, such person's spouse is also executing this Agreement as an Owner.
- 7.1 Releases. Owner hereby releases and agrees to hold harmless the Companies from any and all claims, suits, damages, losses, judgments, and costs, past, present, or future, arising from or in connection with any of the following:
- (a) diminution in the value of the Property or loss of enjoyment of the use of the Property arising out of or related to the abandonment of the Existing Wells and Owner's covenants and agreements in this Agreement;
 - (b) the connection of the Property to the New Lines; or
- (c) the City's provision of water service, Owner's use thereof, or any interruption of, or problems with, Owner's water service.
 - 7.2 1 Owner hereby releases and agrees to hold harmless the City from any and all claims,

suits, damages, losses, judgments, and costs, past, present, or future, arising from or in connection with:

- (a) diminution in the value of the Property or loss of enjoyment of the use of the Property arising out of or related to the abandonment of the Existing Wells and Owner's covenants and agreements in this Agreement
 - (b) abandoning, capping and taking the existing wells out of service
- (c) discussions and communications with companies' agents or representatives concerning this agreement.
- **8. Notice**. Any delivery, notice, approval, request or consent required by or to be given pursuant to this Agreement shall be deemed to be given if it is in writing and mailed by United States mail, postage prepaid, or delivered by hand or overnight delivery service, and addressed as follows:

9. Assignment, Successors, and No Third Party Rights. No party to this Agreement may assign its rights or obligations under this Agreement, except with the prior written approval of the other parties. Subject to the preceding sentence, this Agreement will apply to, be binding in all respects upon, and inure to the benefit of the successors and permitted assigns of the parties. Nothing expressed or referred to in this Agreement will be construed to give any person other than the parties

to this Agreement any legal or equitable right, remedy, or claim under or with respect to this Agreement or any provision of this Agreement.

- 10. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and revokes, supersedes and replaces any prior agreement, arrangement or expression of intent or understanding, oral or written, with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may not be amended except by a written instrument executed by all parties.
- 11. Severability. In the event that any provision or part of any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable in any respect, this Agreement shall continue in effect and such provision or part of a provision shall be excised from this Agreement.
- 12. Waiver. The failure or delay of any party to require performance by the other party of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the rights of such party to require performance.
- 13. Governing Law. This Agreement will be governed by the laws of the State of Iowa without regard to conflicts of laws principles.
- 14. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed to be an original copy of this Agreement and all of which, when taken together, will be deemed to constitute one and the same agreement.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the fees charged for ambulance service provided by the City of Camanche on or after June 1, 2023, are hereby established as follows:

- 1) Basic Life Support Non Emergency Service = \$400
- 2) Basic Life Support Emergency Service = \$620
- 3) Advanced Life Support Non-Emergency Service = \$550
- 4) Advanced Life Support Level 1 Emergency Service = \$735
- 5) Advanced Life Support Level 2 Emergency Service = \$1,065
- 6) Advanced Life Support Non-Transport = \$200
- 7) Charge per Load Mile = \$13

EASEMENT AGREEMENT

NOW, on this day of	, 2023, Cedar Heights, Inc., an Iowa
corporation ("Grantor"), in consideration of	one dollar (\$1.00) and other valuable consideration,
does hereby grant, bargain and convey unto t	he City of Camanche, Iowa, an Iowa municipal
corporation ("Grantee"), an easement, includ	ing the right of ingress and egress, over, through
and across the real estate legally described in	attached Exhibit "A" (Lot 28 of Parcel ID
1003680000) (hereinafter "Easement Area")	for the purpose as set forth herein.

This Easement shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Grantee shall, at its sole expense, erect, construct, maintain, repair and replace four (4) storm shelter structures on said Lot 28.
- 2. Grantee shall be solely responsible for maintenance and repairs of said storm shelter structures and any improvements in, on or over the Easement and Easement Area. Grantor shall be responsible for grounds maintenance of lot 28.
- 3. Grantee shall be solely responsible for payment of all costs associated with the costs of drafting, preparing, reviewing and recording this Easement, including any attorney fees incurred by Grantor in review or preparation of this Easement.
- 4. Grantee, its employees, and agents, and Grantor tenants, shall have the right of access, ingress and egress to the Easement Area and shall have all rights of ingress and egress reasonably necessary for the use and enjoyment of the Easement Area herein described. This Easement shall not grant or confer any rights on the general public.
- 5. Grantee shall be responsible for any damage to Grantor's property or that of third parties resulting from any exercise of the rights herein granted. Grantee shall promptly repair and restore, at its sole cost and expense to its original condition any of Grantor's property that may be altered, damaged or destroyed in connection with Grantee's exercise of the Easement or use of the Easement Area.
- 6. This grant of Easement is made on the express condition that Grantor is to be free from all liability by reason of injury or death to persons or injury to property from whatever cause arising out of Grantee's, its contractors', agents', officers', employees', invitees', or licensees' exercise of rights granted pursuant to this Easement or use of the Easement Area or of any improvements or personal property of Grantee thereto or thereon, including any liability for injury or death to the person or property of Grantee, its contractors, agents, officers, employees, invitees, or licensees, or to any property under the control or custody of Grantee. Grantee hereby

covenants and agrees to defend (with counsel reasonably approved by the Grantor) and indemnify Grantor, its officers, employees, agents, students, invitees and guests, and save them harmless from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, obligations, judgments, awards, fines, losses, damages, expenses, charges or costs of any kind or character whatsoever (including reasonable attorneys' and consultants' fees, expert fees and court costs) on account of, or arising directly or indirectly from or out of any such injury or losses caused or claimed to be caused by the exercise of the Easement or use of the Easement Area by Grantee, its contractors, agents, officers, employees, invitees, or licensees, however occurring, other than, and except to the extent of, those caused solely by the willful or negligent acts or omissions of Grantor, its agents, invitees, or employees.

- 7. Grantor shall not be responsible for any taxes or assessments levied by any governmental agency related, in any manner, to the erection, construction or maintenance of Storm Shelters, or Grantee's use of this Easement.
- 8. This Easement, and the terms, conditions and provisions herein contained, shall continue and remain unless this Easement is terminated by either party by providing six (6) months advance written notice of intent to terminate to the other party. Termination of the agreement by this notice shall require all filings and fees for recording said changes be incurred by the terminating party.
- 9. This instrument contains the entire agreement between the parties relating to the rights herein granted and the obligations herein assumed. Any oral representations or modifications concerning this instrument shall be of no force or effect except in a subsequent modification in writing, signed by the party to be charged.

BUILDING AND FIRE CODE REVIEW

The relevant portions of the Camanche Code regarding Building and Fire Codes appear to be as follows: 3-4-1, The Fire Code; 3-13-1, Property Maintenance; 6-2, Building Sanitary Sewers; 6-3, Building Water Supply Systems; 6-10, Electrical Code; 6-11, Building Code and 6-12, Dangerous Buildings.

In Chapter 3-4-2 of the Camanche Fire Code the City adopts the State Fire Code. Most of the specific provisions of the State Fire Code are set forth in the 661-200 provisions of the Iowa Administrative Code.

At 661-201.2(1) the 2015 International Fire Code is adopted with 7 pages of state-specific amendments. It adopts appendices B, C and D of the 2015 International Fire Code.

By reference, portions of the State Plumbing Code, the International Building Code and the International Residential Code are adopted as parts of the State Fire Code.

The Fire Code specifically adopts Chapters 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of the 2015 International Building Code along with Sections 804 and 805.

At 661-201(4) the State Fire Code is applied to existing buildings and structures regarding additions or alterations, along with all new construction.

At 661-210.2 the State requirements regarding smoke detectors and alarms are applied to all residential occupancies.

As the State Fire Code is administratively updated and adopts updated versions of the International Fire Code, then the Camanche Fire Code is automatically updated, unless the Council takes specific action to delete updates.

Camanche Ordinance 3-13, the Property Maintenance Chapter, does not specifically adopt any national standards. Significant regulation standards would be applied through the State Fire Code and the State Electrical Code, Chapter 103 of the Iowa Code.

Camanche Ordinance 6-10-1 is the City's Electrical Code. It specifically states that all electrical installations within the City shall comply with the latest edition of the National Electric Code. It appears that the 2020 version is the latest adopted version of this Code.

Under Iowa Code Chapter 103.22(7) a homeowner can do electrical work at their own residence. But this work is subject to inspection and must be done to the appropriate standards.

Chapter 103.23 sets forth the properties subject to inspection. This covers all new commercial and industrial applications. It also covers all new residential construction, anytime a new electrical service is installed in an existing home or anytime an electrical hazard is observed.

Chapter 103.24(3) states that the State Inspection Standards do not apply to routine maintenance. Chapter 103.24(5) allows a City to adopt different standards than the National Standards. If a City does this, then the alternate standards must be filed with the State Board. I am not aware that Camanche has taken any such action to adopt alternative standards and place them on file with the State Fire Marshall.

Administrative Code Section 661-504.1 provides that the State Electrical Board has adopted the provisions of the 2020 National Electrical Code and this applies to all inspections done of work by licensed persons and all work subject to inspection after May 1, 2021.

Administrative Code Section 661-504.1(1) sets forth the numerous State changes to the 2020 National Code Standards.

The State Building Code set forth in Chapter 103A of the Code and Administrative Code 661-301 does not appear to have been adopted by the City of Camanche by Ordinance and does not automatically become applicable to the City under 103A.12.

Most of the provisions of the State Building Code, 661-301 and the adopted provisions of the 2015 International Building Code do become applicable and enforceable in Camanche under the provisions of the State Electrical Code, Chapter 103 and the State Fire Code, 661-201(2).

Some provisions of the State Plumbing Code, 661-301(6), the State Mechanical Code and the 2015 International Residential Code are made applicable under the provisions of the State Fire Code, 661-201(2)(1) and 661-301.8.

A specific review of the applicable sections of the 2015 International Building Code, 2015 International Residential Code, 2015 International Fire Code and the 2020 National Electrical Code has not been undertaken to see what specific requirements from each Code has been adopted.

I have not been able to find any specific adoption of the 2015 International Existing Building Code, 661-301.7, by either the State Fire Code or State Electrical Code. Nor do I find any specific reference to the International Property Maintenance Code.

In summary, it appears that significant portions of numerous International Codes and Regulations are applicable and enforceable in Camanche through the State Fire Code and the provisions of Chapter 103 regarding electricians and electrical contractors. There are significantly more enforcement tools available to the City than the limited regulations specifically set forth in the Camanche Code.
