Mayor Pruett read the 2nd Reading of an Ordinance Amending Title 2 Chapter 4 Salaries of Administrative Officers by Title only. This Ordinance amendment increases Council pay from \$600 per year to \$1,200 per year and Mayor pay from \$3,000 per year with a \$300 annual expense allowance to \$4,000 per year with a \$500 annual expense allowance for each official elected after November 7, 2023.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Varner to approve the 2nd reading of an Ordinance Amending Title 2 Chapter 4 Salaries of Administrative Officers by Title only. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmen Varner, Schnoor, Bowman, Determann. Nays – None. Absent – Councilman Weller.

Moved by Councilman Varner, second by Councilman Bowman to waive the 3rd reading of an Ordinance Amending Title 2 Chapter 4 Salaries of Administrative Officers. On roll call – Ayes – Councilman Bowman, Determann, Varner, Schnoor. Nays – None. Absent – Councilman Weller.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Schnoor to Adopt an Ordinance Amending Title 2 Chapter 4 Salaries of Administrative Officers. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmen Determann, Bowman, Schnoor, Varner. Nays – None. Absent – Councilman Weller.

Mayor Pruett read a Resolution approving the Easement Agreement with MidAmerican Energy on Property Located at 409 9^{th} Avenue, Camanche, Iowa. City Administrator Kida noted two necessary corrections on the Resolution; the address needs to be 409 9^{th} Avenue and in Exhibit A it should be 13 feet, not 25 feet. Also, Grantor was changed to Grantee.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Varner to adopt a Resolution approving Easement Agreement with MidAmerica Energy on Property Located at 409 9th Avenue, Camanche, Iowa, as amended. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Varner to Authorize Public Works Director to purchase road salt for winter, not to exceed \$13,000.00. On roll call – all Ayes.

Kida led a discussion regarding the RFQ submissions for Energy Savings Program. He reported there were four submissions: Orion, Green, Trane and ABM. A representative from Trane attended the meeting to address Council and answer any questions. He said he would be the point of contact and summarized what they would do. He also said there are no change orders on their projects, they take the risks. They do not come back for more money. He said it was an honor to work on the submission and thanked Council for allowing him to be there. At 6:18 p.m., Dan Lawlor from ABM arrived. He had a flat tire on the way to the meeting. He

addressed Council and offered to answer any questions regarding his RFQ. After a brief discussion, Councilman Bowman suggested the item be tabled until the next meeting to allow Councilmembers to review the information submitted. Kida pointed out that everyone has the contact information for each submission, should they have questions.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Varner to Authorize Chief Schutte to apply for CCDA Grant for a Public Safety UTV. On roll call — all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Varner, second by Councilman Bowman to Authorize Chief Schmitz to apply for CCDA Grant for HVAC upgrades and rear parking lot upgrades at the Police Station. On roll call – all Ayes.

Chief Schmitz presented the June 2023 Camanche Police Department Report and Chief Schutte presented the June 2023 Camanche Fire Department Report.

Kida reported that he attended IaCMA last week. There was a lot of good discussion about the new tax plan and housing issues. Councilman Schnoor said this past weekend was the third annual First Responders Side-by-Side event. There were probably 300 vehicles involved and it was amazing. People praised what Camanche did, from the Police to the pulled pork sandwiches served so they did not even have to leave their vehicles. He said people went crazy and he thanked everyone who was involved in the event. Councilman Varner praised the young people doing the Camanche Days fireworks fundraising. Councilman Bowman said the past couple years in our budget discussions, we talked about storm water utility and have not gone any further than that. He would like staff to prepare some proposals so we can discuss storm water utility in the future at a Council meeting and decide whether we want to go that direction. He does not want this to get dropped because we need to maintain our infrastructure. Kida will work on that. Pewe informed Council they are in the middle of residential lead and copper sampling. There will be a large water main flush done next week on the river side of the tracks and letters mailed to the affected residents; it will also be posted on social media. The SCADA parts are in, now we need to get on their schedule for installation. The DNR was here for the well site visits so we are closer to getting that done, hopefully this fall. It will be 4-5 weeks on parts for temporary 200-amp service at Well 5 so we are looking at the end of August to shut off the generator. Chief Schutte also talked about the Side-by-Side event Councilman Schnoor discussed. The Fire Department served 425 baskets in 45 minutes, it was an excellent fundraiser and a great event for the community and a great event to be a part of. He also reported the storm shelter project is done and fully functional. Chief Schmitz also commented on the UTV ride. He said that he stopped at each of the establishments after the event and asked if there was any way that they could have improved on, getting people in and out and they all said they would not change a thing. He also said the Camanche School Board passed the extension of the 28E Agreement for the School Resource Officer Program so we are good to go for this year on the current agreement and the next five years with the extension.

Mayor Pruett called for Public Comments. There were none.

Mayor Pruett adjourned the meeting at 6:46 p.m.

ORDINANCE	

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAMANCHE, IOWA MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING TITLE 6 CHAPTER 11 BUILDING CODE OF THE CAMANCHE CODE OF ORDINANCES.

- Section 1. **Purpose.** The purpose of this ordinance is to amend the Camanche Municipal Code by modifying Title 6 Physical Environment Chapter 11 Building Code.
- Section 2. **Facts Found.** The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa hereby makes the following findings of fact:
 - 1. The City of Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances was codified in 2019
 - 2. Title 6 Chapter 11 Building Code is based on ordinances primarily passed in 1948
 - 3. The City of Camanche desires to adopt modern building standards within the City
 - 4. It is in the best interest of the City of Camanche to amend Title 6 Chapter 11

Section 3. <u>Amendment.</u> Title 6 Chapter 11 existing sections are repealed and the following language is inserted in lieu thereof:

TITLE VI PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT

CHAPTER 11 BUILDING CODE

- 6-11-1 District Established and State of Iowa Building Code 103A Adopted
- 6-11-2 Enforcement Authority
- 6-11-3 Building Permit Required
- 6-11-4 Building Permit Fees
- 6-11-5 Exclusions
- 6-11-6 Automatic Sprinklers
- 6-11-7 Swimming Pools and Pools
- 6-11-8 Concrete/Asphalt Pads
- 6-11-9 Rights of entry into Inspect
- 6-11-10 Appeals
- 6-11-1 DISTRICT ESTABLISHED AND INTERNITATIONAL BUILDING CODE ADOPTED. For the purpose of this Chapter the entire City is districted into one district. The City of Camanche adopts the State of Iowa Building Code 103 A and all requirements excluding the sections set forth in this ordinance.
- 6-11-2 ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY. It shall be the duty of the Building Inspector to enforce the provisions of this Chapter, but any or all of the powers and duties conferred on the Building Inspector by this Chapter may be delegated or transferred to any other officer or

employee of the City except for the approval of completed work requiring certification under the code identified in 6-11-1.

- 6-11-3 BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED. Permits under International Building Code 2015 Chapter 1 Section 105 are required in the City of Camanche with the following modifications:
 - A. 105.2 Work Exempt from Permit is hereby modified to require permits for the following:
 - 1) Detached accessory structures require permitting under Camanche Zoning Ordinance 18.70.210
 - 2) Fences require permitting under Camanche Zoning Ordinance 18.70.250
 - 3) Sidewalks and driveways require permitting under Camanche Ordinance 6-7 Subdivision and 6-8 Sidewalks

A permit shall be issued if the work as proposed in the application for a permit meets all of the requirements of this title and the Zoning Ordinance Chapter 18.80. If plans and specifications of the proposed work are requested or required, the plans and specifications must also meet the requirements of this chapter. No action will be taken by the city on plans and specifications for industrial buildings until a fire protection plan has been filed with the fire chief by the owner and the fire chief has reported to the Planning and Zoning Commission regarding plans and specifications.

- 6-11-4 BUILDING PERMIT FEES. The fees for each permit shall be as established from time to time by resolution of the City Council and shall be paid at the time the building permit is issued.
- 6-11-5 EXCLUSION. Section 101.4 of the 2015 International Building Code is excluded unless otherwise established in the Camanche Code of Ordinances. Section 102.4.1 of the 2015 International Building Code is excluded. Contradictions between the 2015 International Building Code, Iowa State Code 103A and the Camanche Code of Ordinances shall defer to the Camanche Code of Ordinances.
- 6-11-6 AUTOMATIC SPRINKLERS. The regulations in the 2015 International Building Code requiring automatic sprinklers are removed. Title 3 Chapter 4 of the Camanche Code of Ordinances, adopting the Iowa State Fire Code, shall control the requirements for automatic sprinklers.
- 6-11-7 SWIMMING POOLS AND POOLS. The regulations set forth in this section shall regulate all swimming pools and pools. This section shall supersede any requirements set forth in the adopted building code adopted in section 6-11-1
 - 1. A swimming pool is a water-filled enclosure, permanently constructed or portable, having a depth of more than two feet, which is outdoors or has access from the outdoors if partially enclosed used for the primary purpose of swimming, diving, recreational or therapeutic bathing. A pool is an outdoor structure for containing water with an interior depth of more than two feet above or below grade. A pool is a body of standing water in a structure, basin or depression above or below grade, having an interior depth of

more than two feet.

- 2. All present or hereinafter constructed outdoor swimming pools shall be enclosed by a four-foot fence and a building permit must be obtained for both the swimming pool and the fence. Such fencing shall be of material and sufficient strength and anchoring so as to support two hundred fifty pounds of side pressure weight per ten feet of length without collapsing. Fencing enclosures shall be a minimum of four feet from the base of the swimming pool. This section shall be construed as applying to artificially constructed swimming pools above or below ground level even though they might not be in use. All persons constructing a pool shall so enclose the same before commencing to fill the pool. A building permit once obtained for a swimming pool at an address identified on the building permit is valid for so long as enclosed by a fence as required in the Zoning Ordinance Sec. 18.60.240 whether annually dismantled and assembled each year. All other present or future constructed pools as defined in 6-11-7 subsection 1 shall be enclosed by a four-foot fence and a building permit must be obtained for the fence unless otherwise detailed in this ordinance.
- 3. A rigid sided swimming pool with a height of at least four feet may attach a two-foot fence to the top of the swimming pool or to a deck built around the swimming pool. The fence must surround the entire swimming pool and have an adequate childproof locking gate access point as a substitute for the four-foot fence requirement in 6-11-7 subsection 3. All such fencing shall be of material and sufficient strength and anchoring so as to support two hundred fifty pounds of side pressure weight per ten feet of length without collapsing.
- 4. This section shall also apply to a spa or spa pool regardless of size, but shall not apply to natural swimming areas or natural areas of water on agricultural land.
- 5. Exemption. Wading pools are exempt from this regulation. A wading pool is a portable structure for holding water, or a body of standing water, basin or depression constructed for holding water with an interior depth of less than two feet.
- 6-11-8 CONCRETE/ASPHALT PADS. It is unlawful to build, enlarge or alter, or construct any concrete or asphalt pad without a building permit. The concrete or asphalt pad shall conform to setbacks as required for garages or accessory buildings and provided in this title or Title 18 (Zoning Ordinance).
- 6-11-9 RIGHT OF ENTRY TO INSPECT. The building inspector, fire chief or other authorized representative of the City may enter any premises upon presentation of proper credentials for the purpose of inspecting for compliance with this chapter and title, at such times as may be reasonably necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare and may after entry perform any duties imposed upon the official. Prior to such entry, the owner and/or occupant shall, if the owner and/or occupant can be located after reasonable effort, be given twenty-four hours written notice of the authorized official's intention to inspect and the general purpose of the inspection. The notice shall state that the property owner and/or occupant has the right to refuse entry and in the event such entry is refused, inspection may be made only upon issuance of a search warrant issued by a duly authorized magistrate or other

court of competent jurisdiction. Whenever entry is refused, the city representative may seek assistance from any magistrate or court of competent jurisdiction in order to obtain the entry. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event of an emergency situation or when consent of the owner and/or occupant to the inspection and entry cannot be otherwise obtained, the city representative may enter and inspect only upon issuance of a search warrant issued by a duly authorized magistrate or court of competent jurisdiction. If the provisions of this section shall conflict with any other provision of this code, then the more specific section shall govern.

6-11-10 APPEALS. Any person or persons aggrieved by any decision of the Building Inspector shall have a right of appeal to the City Administrator. If aggrieved by any decision of the City Administrator that person shall have a right of appeal to the City Council provided, that a notice of appeal is filed in writing with the City Administrator within ten days from the date of such decision. Filing the notice of appeal with the City Clerk shall be deemed full compliance with the above filing requirements, except that the notice of appeal shall specify the grounds thereof.

Section 4. <u>Repealer.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. <u>Severability Clause.</u> If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect this ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 6. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in full effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

MIDAMERICAN ENERGY COMPANY REFUNDABLE ADVANCE FOR CONSTRUCTION OVERHEAD ELECTRIC SERVICE EXTENSION PROPOSAL FOR SPECULATIVE USE – WMIS 3027175

MidAmerican Energy Company, an Iowa corporation and City of Camanche ("Applicant"), agree as follows:

- 1. MidAmerican Energy Company will extend its three-phase electric lines overhead to City of Camanche.
- 2. MidAmerican Energy Company will furnish the necessary labor and materials required to fulfill its undertaking, as specified above. Such work will commence by MidAmerican Energy Company as soon as reasonable and practicable after the execution of this Proposal and receipt of Applicant's cash deposit indicated below. MidAmerican Energy Company will prosecute such work to completion with reasonable diligence.
- 3. In consideration of the receipt of a payment in the amount of \$13,022.48 from Applicant, which is an Advance for Construction subject to refund, MidAmerican Energy Company agrees to construct necessary electric facilities as set forth above. Please submit payment with Applicant's signed acceptance of this Proposal. If Applicant's acceptance and payment is not received by October 27, 2023, the amount may be subject to change.
- 4. The Advance for Construction shall be subject to refund by MidAmerican Energy Company to Applicant based upon the following terms and conditions:
 - a. Advances shall not accrue interest and shall be subject to refund from the date of original advance payment. The refunds will span a six-year period and annual refunds will be made at the rate of fifty percent (50%) of the incremental difference between the current annual metered electric service bill of the above Applicant, as described below, and Applicant's future usage through the following annual period. The Applicant's current usage is based on 31,474 billed kWh for the twelve-month billing period starting 7/11/22 through 7/10/23 for electric meter S64073780 resulting in the established annual billing of \$2,701.55. Base revenue shall be estimated annual revenue, less fuel expense costs, based on similarly situated customers.
 - b. If additional three-phase customers are connected to the above-described line extension, the above Applicant shall receive refunds equal to three times estimated base revenue for each additional new customer to the extent that such revenue exceeds the additional distribution construction costs incurred by the MidAmerican Energy Company. Base revenue shall be estimated annual revenue, less fuel expense costs, based on similarly situated customers.
 - c. Refunds shall be made on the anniversary of the date of the original advance payment, or sooner at the option of the MidAmerican Energy Company.



- d. Revenue for un-metered private lighting shall not be included in any refund.
- e. No refunds shall be made for revenue received after six years from the date of the original advance payment.
- f. Never shall the total of refunds exceed the refundable portion of the payment stated above.
- g. No refunds shall be made for customers served from a further extension of the above-described electric line extension.
- 5. Applicant shall provide, without cost to MidAmerican Energy Company, such easements as are necessary and incidental to such installation and use of MidAmerican Energy Company's facilities on private property within the area served. If a 3rd party easement is required any cost associated in obtaining the easement will be paid by the applicant.
- 6. Pursuant to MidAmerican's tariff, the Applicant is required to pay actual permit fees. Permit fees may not be offset by Revenue Credit and are to be paid regardless of whether the applicant is required to pay a Refundable Advance or a Nonrefundable Contribution.
- 7. Applicant shall be responsible for locating and marking all privately owned systems such as water services, culverts, irrigation systems, drainpipes, septic lines, and underground wiring before MidAmerican Energy Company's construction.
- 8. It is specifically understood and agreed that any distribution systems, or other facilities constructed or installed by MidAmerican Energy Company under terms of this Proposal shall remain the sole property of MidAmerican Energy Company and MidAmerican Energy Company shall determine, as its own judgement indicates, the manner and method of utilization thereof and to extend the same or connect other facilities thereto and serve other customers therefrom as it shall see fit, subject only to such obligations as MidAmerican Energy Company shall have assumed in this Proposal; and no other person shall have any right, title, interest or claim, in or to the said distribution system or other facilities by virtue of any provision of the Proposal.
