On roll call — all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Klahn to Adopt a Resolution calling for a Public Hearing to Amend Chapter 18.24.050 R-1 Front Yard Requirements: A. Dwellings of the Camanche Zoning Code of Ordinances. On roll call — all Ayes.

City Administrator Kida gave a slide presentation regarding Storm Water Funding. Each \$1 per month per customer will amount to \$21,600 annually so \$5 per month would only repay \$2 million in debt and not allow for other work to be done. To accomplish the storm water work that needs to be done, Kida said we can borrow against a new storm water utility fee, the road use fund which would mean less road work could be done, or we could levy the taxpayers. Councilman Edens would like to talk to Public Works Director Pewe about the priority list to see if he agrees and would like to overlay this with the street plan. He envisions a map with trouble areas highlighted and the Street Improvement Plan streets highlighted. Councilman Bowman agrees that we need a comprehensive plan, but we still need revenue to fund these things. He would like to see a distinction between residential, commercial and industrial. Kida said the appropriate way is to look at how much you need first and then go back and see how you get there. Additional detailed discussion followed; this topic will be revisited.

City Administrator Kida and Public Works Director Pewe led a discussion regarding Water Meter Funding. The cost will be approximately \$750,000. It is anticipated that letters will go out to residents in mid to late June with installations starting in July. Councilman Bowman asked what is needed from Council. Kida talked about determining the amount to borrow. We have approximately \$100,000 in the Water Maintenance CD, \$100,000 in the Water Meter Fund CD then could use \$150,000 of the Water Fund and borrow \$400,000 and increase the Water Meter Charge, using that to repay the debt. We would leave the meter charge at that rate to replenish the Water Meter fund after the debt is paid. The new meters have many features including an app for residents and labor savings for the reading of the meters.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Klahn to Approve the Bargaining Unit Wage proposed Side Letter for FY2025. On roll call – all Ayes.

Kida explained the Department Head contracts were also amended, with the Bargaining Unit Side Letter in mind. The Department Heads will be paying 20% for health insurance and their pay will be increased to accommodate the increased cost to them. The cost/benefit is the same for the City, it just creates separation, and helps Department Heads closing in on retirements.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Edens to Approve Amendments to the Department Head Contracts through a proposed side letter for FY2025. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Klahn to Adopt a Resolution Adopting the FY2025 Budget. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Edens to Adopt a Resolution calling for a Public Hearing to amend the FY2024 Budget – $1^{\rm st}$ Amendment. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Edens, second by Councilman Klahn to Approve the First Reading of an Ordinance amending Title 2 Chapter 9 Section on Planning and Zoning Commission of the Camanche Code of Ordinances. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmen Weller, Edens, Klahn, Bowman. Nays – None.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Edens to suspend the Rules of Procedure. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Weller to approve the reading of a Resolution by Title Only, funding for the Splash Pad. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Klahn to Adopt a Resolution Authorizing and Approving a Loan Agreement, Providing for the Issuance of a \$400,000.00 General Obligation Corporate Purpose Note, Series 2024 and Providing for the Livy of Taxes to Pay the Same. On roll call – all Ayes.

Police Chief Schmitz presented the March 2024 Camanche Police Department Report.

City Administrator Kida sought Council input about hiring a colleague to do a goal setting session. He said it would be Pat Callahan or Mark Jackson at a cost of \$800-\$1,000 and be in a workshop format. Council agreed. He also informed Council that a young gentleman in a Master's in Organizational Management program reached out to him regarding an internship program. He said he would do it for free. Kida asked Council if they would agree to bring him in for 20 hours a week at minimum wage, approximately \$2,500, over the summer to work on the Urban Renewal plan as Kida does not have time to work on that. Councilman Klahn asked where he is from. Originally, he is from Eldridge, but he is now in Camanche. All agreed. Councilman Edens asked the capacity of the Community Center; Kida said 200. Councilman Klahn asked about how to beautify the roundabout. Pewe said this is in process, either flowers or colored stones.

Jess Paul 1924-14th Street spoke. He said regarding the storm water funding, it sounds like we have a contract with Shive. Kida said they are our City Engineers. Mr. Paul said he has experiences with them. He told Council to speak to Dan Srp and the Chief Deputy and see about their experiences with that group. There have been problems.

A brief recess was taken at 7:32 p.m.

The meeting reconvened in Open Session at 7:41p.m.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Edens to go to Closed Session at 7:41 p.m. On roll call – all Ayes.

Reconvened to Open Session at 8:05 p.m. at which time Mayor Pro Tem Bowman adjourned the meeting.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAMANCHE IOWA MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING TITLE 2 CHAPTER 9 PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION SECTION 1 OF THE CAMANCHE CODE OF ORDINANCES

<u>Section 1. Purpose.</u> The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the number of members designated to the City of Camanche Planning and Zoning Commission.

Section 2. Facts Found. The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa hereby makes the following findings of fact:

- A. The Planning and Zoning Commission was created in 1958 to be composed of seven citizens
- B. The City of Camanche finds it more appropriate to manage the Commission with five members

<u>Section 3. Amendment.</u> The Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances for the Planning and Zoning Commission is hereby amended as follows:

Ordinance 2-9-1 CREATED. There is created a City Planning and Zoning Commission, composed of five (5) residents of the City, who shall be qualified by knowledge and experience to act in matters pertaining to the development of city planning and zoning, none of whom shall hold any elective position in the City. Such members shall be recommended by the Mayor and appointed by the Council.

<u>Section 4. Repealer.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 5. Severability Clause.</u> If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 6. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in full effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE	

AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE FIFTH AVENUE RAILWAY CROSSING IN CAMANCHE, IOWA.

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to provide for the vacation of a portion of Fifth Avenue in Camanche, Iowa that serves as the at-grade public road crossing over the railway tracks of the Canadian Pacific Kansas City Southern Railroad (hereinafter "Canadian Pacific").

Section 2. Facts Found. The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa hereby makes the following finding of fact:

- A. Canadian Pacific owns and operates railway tracks and right-of-way that cross seven streets within the City of Camanche.
- B. One of the seven streets that Canadian Pacific's track crosses is at Fifth Avenue between 4th Street and 5th Street.
- C. Iowa Code Section 354.23 allows a City to vacate a street which is deemed to be of no benefit to the public.
- D. Traffic studies have shown that the Fifth Avenue crossing is the least used of the seven railway crossings in Camanche.
- E. Separate railway crossing of Canadian Pacific's track exist one block to the northeast of Fifth Avenue on Fourth Avenue and two blocks to the southwest on Seventh Avenue.
- F. At-grade public road railway crossings are hazardous to pedestrians and motor vehicles.
- G. The vacation of the Fifth Avenue crossing will not deny owners of abutting property reasonable access to their property.
- H. Notice of a public hearing on the proposed vacation of the Fifth Avenue railway crossing has been published as required by law.
- I. The public hearing has been held at the time and place as specified in the notice and any and all objections or other comments relating to the proposal have been heard.
- J. The City Council hereby determines that the Fifth Avenue crossing is of no benefit to the public. Other railway crossings are available nearby, and vacating the crossing will increase public safety.

Section 3. Vacation. The portion of Fifth Avenue that serves as an at-grade public road crossing over railway track owned by Canadian Pacific is hereby vacated, subject to existing easements and franchises as described in Section 4.

Section 4. Easements and Franchises. This vacation is subject to all existing utility franchises, easements, licenses, and permits, whether or not of record, and there is reserved unto the City of Camanche and its franchisees an easement for purposes of the presence, operation, maintenance, repair, and replacement of all existing utilities over, under, and through such portion of street, with right of entry for servicing the same.

Section 5. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Severability Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect this ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 6. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in full effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

AGREEMENT FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE CLINTON COUNTY COMMUNITY STUDENT LOAN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The undersigned participating agencies agree pursuant to Chapter 28E of the Code of Iowa as follows:

SECTION 1

Purpose and the Agreement

This agreement is made to administer a community student loan assistance program. Each participating agency that signs a copy of this Agreement has and does express its intent to share the cost of the Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program.

The objectives of this Agreement are to define the responsibilities of each of the parties for the payment and administration of the community student loan assistance program.

SECTION 2

Administration and Payment

The Clinton County Auditor's Office shall be the administrative agent between the Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program and the third-party administrator.

The Clinton County Auditor's Office shall:

- a) Collect all payments (fees and contributions) due to the third-party administrator for appropriate distribution with regards to payment due dates of the third-party administrator
- b) Make all payments to the third-party administrator
- c) Transmit all records of participation to the third-party administrator
- d) Maintain confidential records in accordance with County policy
- e) Share all pertinent communications between the third-party administrator and participating agencies of the Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program
- f) Provide each participating agency of the Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program the amount due for the annual administrative fee each year before September 15

Participating agencies of the Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program shall:

- a) Provide all pertinent information and payments for the program to the Clinton County Auditor in a timely manner
- b) Make all payments to "Clinton County Auditor's Office" and reference the Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program with the payment
- c) Provide a roster of participants and any changes on a monthly basis
- d) Pay the Clinton County Auditor's Office the annual administrative fee each year before September 30

e) Initial Appendix A to this agreement to certify the participating agency's monthly participant contribution commitment

SECTION 3

Additions to the Program

Entities that choose to join the 28E Agreement will be added with participation to begin July 1.

SECTION 4

Withdrawal/Termination

Participating agencies of the Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program may withdraw from the program with 90 days notice to the Clinton County Auditor's Office. The withdrawing participating agency will be liable for all contributions and fees for which it owes.

Any participating agency that fails to meet its fiscal responsibilities to the Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program shall be terminated by written notice from the Clinton County Auditor's Office.

Any participating agency that either withdraws or is terminated will be responsible for communicating such status to those individuals participating in the program through said agency.

Termination does not relieve any party of its financial obligations under this agreement.

SECTION 5

Agreement Termination

The Clinton County Community Student Loan Assistance Program 28E Agreement will be terminated on June 30, 2024, in the absence of a renewal of this agreement or an amendment to this agreement.


