City of Camanche July 15, 2025

The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa met in regular session July 15, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. at Camanche City Hall. Present on roll call: Mayor Austin Pruett presiding, and Council members Bowman, Edens, Farrell, Klahn and Weller. Also present were City Attorneys Current, Frey and Roberts, City Administrator Kida, and Department Heads Grim, Pewe, Schmitz, Schutte and Schneider.

A moment of silent prayer was observed. Mayor Pruett led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Weller to approve the Agenda. On roll call – all Ayes.

Visitor Brenda Larkey informed Council that this year's Camanche Days theme is Bingo, it's Camanche Days. The Grand Marshall is Marty Schnoor and King and Queen are Frank and Pat Greve. She listed multiple activities that will take place before and during the annual celebration. She thanked Mayor Pruett, City Council and City Hall staff for their continued support, Councilman Bowman for helping Teen Board, Gaylon and the Public Works crew for set-up and tear-down, Chief Schmitz and the Camanche PD and Chief Schutte and said the Fire Department's value is priceless to Camanche Days. She also gave a rundown of the events and entertainment and expressed gratitude for the support of the Community.

Rock Creek Solar and Nextera made a donation of \$3,900.00 to the Camanche Fire Department Pancake Breakfast which is a fund raiser for Muscular Dystrophy. Kimberly Dickey presented Chief Schutte with a check, adding that this is the fourth year Rock Creek Solar has supported Camanche Days and specifically, the pancake breakfast.

Visitor Karlee Low along with Kathy Klahn, from the Hometown Pride Committee, thanked everyone for the splash pad and said it is rewarding to see the town have this vision, have it completed and see families enjoying it. She said Camanche Hometown Pride raised \$15,000 for extras. Kiwanis and other people are contacting her about purchasing extra benches and sponsoring shades for the benches. There will also be two picnic tables, one being ADA compliant, and a bike rack and they would like to have the City purchase the items, and then donate the money to the City to save the sales tax. They would like to order these items now so they can be installed for use this summer. Kida recommends making sure the Park and Recreation Commission is okay with everything. Mrs. Low said they have been working together. The Mayor said there is an agenda item tonight to authorize the purchase.

Mayor Pruett called for public comments on Agenda topics. Gary Hill 620 3rd Street spoke to revisit the Nuisance Ordinance. He said if the City would have kept up 9 months ago, when he complained about this nuisance, instead of through the lengthy process, it wouldn't be there today. It's not a hidden secret that the City is, well, they like it because he cleans the City up, takes the junk home and dumps it. He can tell the City has made contact with him because he stopped hauling junk in now, and the junk laying in front of the garage door, is on City property, got covered up with a tarp so nobody can see it. 9 months ago, he cleaned it up,

cleaned part of it up, so then he started hanging tarps up to make walls to nobody could see the stuff. And yet the City put out there that a tarp isn't made for a roof, yet across from my house, I have tarps hanging all over the place to cover junk up, but yet, that's alright. If the City would have stayed with it, we wouldn't have the situation today. Thank you.

Under Unfinished Business was an Ordinance vacating a 20'strip of City Property, in Chicago Street Park, adjacent to 821 1st Street to allow for the sale of the property to the owners of that property. Mayor Pruett read the Second Reading, By Title Only, of An Ordinance Vacating 20' of City Property approximately 1,200 square feet of what is more commonly known as Chicago Street Park dedicating it to become part of 821 1st Street.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Weller to Approve the Second Reading, By Title Only, of An Ordinance Vacating 20' of City Property approximately 1,200 square feet of what is more commonly known as Chicago Street Park dedicating it to becomes

part of 821 1st Street. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmembers Edens, Klahn, Farrell, Bowman, Weller. Nays – None.

Moved by Councilman Edens second by Councilman Klahn to Waive the Third Reading of An Ordinance Vacating 20' of City Property approximately 1,200 square feet of what is more commonly known as Chicago Street Park dedicating it to becomes part of 821 1st Street. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmembers Bowman, Klahn, Edens, Farrell, Weller. Nays – None.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Weller to Adopt An Ordinance Vacating 20' of City Property approximately 1,200 square feet of what is more commonly known as Chicago Street Park dedicating it to becomes part of 821 1st Street. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmembers Klahn, Edens, Weller, Bowman, Farrell. Nays – None.

Also under Unfinished Business was a continuation of the discussion of CPKC Railroad and EMS Services. Councilman Klahn turned it over to Chief Schutte, who said he got an email back from the railroad explaining the mechanisms they have in place to minimize the blockage of our crossings. They also reiterated to call the phone number on the signs placed at each crossing when people experience blocked crossings. Schutte said they did recently call that number and the response was good. Councilman Bowman then continued the discussion, saying that he did some digging into the costs of an overpass. He said Dubuque installed one for \$38.7 million in the middle of town, getting a \$25 million grant. Davenport installed one for \$9.7 million that was out away from residential or businesses, getting a \$7.8 million grant. He added that we don't know if we don't look and recommends that we put it out for bid. When we find out, then we put it out for a vote. Regarding grants, we cannot get grants on a dream. City Engineer Solchenberger added more details about the type of overpass and the potential property acquisition needed for options. Further discussion ensued.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Edens to direct staff to put out an RFP for engineering for an overpass. On roll call – all Ayes.

City Attorney Roberts shared details about the legal process for addressing nuisances. He explained that the process is often a lengthy one due to a number of reasons, including the timing of when these cases are heard by the court. Councilman Bowman said it is good to know that the City is not just sitting on these.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Farrell to Authorize the Purchase of benches, picnic table and bench shades for the Splash Pad, up to \$15,000 to be reimbursed to Hometown Pride. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Edens, second by Councilman Klahn to Approve Payment Request to Camanche Days \$3,000.00 for Insurance. On roll call – all Ayes.

A detailed discussion on Camanche Code of Ordinances 6-11-7 Pools focused on definitions and the requirement for fences, specifically detention and retention ponds. Kida asked City Attorney Current to speak on the topic. Current said that a retention pond always

has water and it is more of a safety issue and you want to discuss these. A detention pond is usually a nice grassy area and 99.9% of the time it does not have water in it. Then, what about farm ponds; there is a certain amount of discretion. The requirement for a fence is a legislative decision. Councilman Bowman brought up the planned Fareway retention pond at 8' in depth and said we should do something preventative. Councilman Klahn agrees with Bowman, pointing out that we changed the golf cart ordinance after we lost a child; that was bad. Now we have an Ordinance we can enforce. City Attorney Frey said it is really a matter of educating ourselves and making a decision. Swimming pools attract kids. He suggested first, looking at how other cities deal with this, and second, what do safety people have to say; that is a good measure when making a decision. As Councilman Klahn said, we have a policy we are not enforcing. He asked if it would hurt to form a group to look at it and come back with recommendation. All agreed. Further consideration will be on the next agenda.

A detailed discussion regarding Transportation Alternative Set Aside Funds began with Councilman Edens asking where the City's \$120,000 match would come from. Kida said it could come from the Road Use Fund or the General Fund. He said he talked with Mrs. Low who said Hometown Pride could get behind this; bring young families to town and we should do anything we can to make our town more inviting. Kida added that there are a lot of other grants Hometown Pride could apply for. These funds need to be spent by the end of FY2027 and the application deadline is August 12th. Councilman Bowman said he doesn't want to rush into this, we need to think it through. Councilman Weller said that's why we have the Trail Plan, Capital Improvement Plan and Street Improvement Plan too. The Camanche Schools Superintendent is very excited about the project for the safety of the children walking to and from school.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Weller To Adopt a Resolution authorizing the applications for Transportation Alternative Set Aside Funds through the Regional Planning Authority not to exceed \$500,000. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmen Weller, Bowman, Farrell. Nays – Councilmen Kłahn, Edens.

Chief Schutte presented the June 2025 Camanche Fire Department report and Chief Schmitz presented the June 2025 Camanche Police Department report.

Kida recognized Dave Schutte for 19 years of service as Fire Chief and 34 years with the Fire Department. He also thanked the staff and Councilman Bowman for showing up to the VOYA presentation today. Mayor Pruett congratulated Chief Schutte. Councilman Farrell would like to see Chief Schutte get to 20 years as Chief. Councilman Bowman said he got a call from the child of a deceased resident who did not pay their water bill on time and got a late fee. Councilman Weller thanked Chief Schutte for all his time. Chief Schmitz informed Council that he has extended a conditional offer to the 9th Officer. She will begin in December after finishing her Law Enforcement degree. City Engineer Solchenberger looked up and gave the drainage rates of the soil during a 100-year storm at Fareway's ponds in inches per hour, a very quick rate.

Mayor Pruett called for Public Comments. Gary Hill 620 3rd Street said as far as the City coming back, he knows when the City comes back because he cleans the property up. In

between, it's been a junk hole. It's not only cleaning the property up. Hill can show videos of people backed up. Last Friday night. Last Saturday afternoon he backed up somebody else's vehicle and they're directing him in there and they dumped the junk. And the day that Mr. Bowman was there, somebody dumped off a hot water heater, somebody drops off a wash machine. Over the weekend, there was two refrigerators a wash machine and two hot water heaters being dropped off there. So, it's not just cleaning the property up, it's stopping people from dumping their junk there. So, we have two instances. Cleaning the property up is one thing but what are you going to do to stop people from dumping their junk there? He continued to reiterate the same points.

Kimberly Dickey introduced Luke, the Solar Project Site Supervisor, who gave an overview of construction to date. He said 50% of the gravel is done with 7 of 10 of the permanent entrances done and 20% of solar grading. Ms. Dickey added details of vegetation management that has been done at the site as well as clover and the oats that have been harvested and offered to the landowners free of charge.

There were no additional public comments.

Mayor Pruett asked for requests from Councilmembers for items for future Agendas. There were no requests at this time.

A brief recess was taken at 8:00 p.m. Reconvened at 8:09 p.m.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Farrell to go to Closed Session. On roll call – all Ayes.

Reconvened in Open Session at 9:39 p.m. at which time Mayor Pruett adjourned the meeting.

- 6-11-7 SWIMMING POOLS AND POOLS. The regulations set forth in this section shall regulate all swimming pools and pools. This section shall supersede any requirements set forth in the adopted building code adopted in section 6-11-1
 - 1. A swimming pool is a water-filled enclosure, permanently constructed or portable, having a depth of more than two feet, which is outdoors or has access from the outdoors if partially enclosed used for the primary purpose of swimming, diving, recreational or therapeutic bathing. A pool is an outdoor structure for containing water with an interior depth of more than two feet above or below grade. A pool is a body of standing water in a structure, basin or depression above or below grade, having an interior depth of more than two feet.
 - 2. All present or hereinafter constructed outdoor swimming pools shall be enclosed by a four-foot fence and a building permit must be obtained for both the swimming pool and the fence. Such fencing shall be of material and sufficient strength and anchoring so as to support two hundred fifty pounds of side pressure weight per ten feet of length without collapsing. Fencing enclosures shall be a minimum of four feet from the base of the swimming pool on all hereinafter constructed pools. This section shall be construed as applying to artificially constructed swimming pools above or below ground level even though they might not be in use. All persons constructing a pool shall so enclose the same before commencing to fill the pool. A building permit once obtained for a swimming pool at an address identified on the building permit is valid for so long as enclosed by a fence as required in the Zoning Ordinance Sec. 18.60.240 whether annually dismantled and assembled each year. All other present or future constructed pools as defined in 6-11-7 subsection 1 shall be enclosed by a four-foot fence and a building permit must be obtained for the fence unless otherwise detailed in this ordinance.
 - 3. A rigid sided swimming pool with a height of at least four feet may attach a two-foot fence to the top of the swimming pool or to a deck built around the swimming pool. The fence must surround the entire swimming pool and have an adequate childproof locking gate access point as a substitute for the four-foot fence requirement in 6-11-7 subsection 3. All such fencing shall be of material and sufficient strength and anchoring so as to support two hundred fifty pounds of side pressure weight per ten feet of length without collapsing.
 - 4. This section shall also apply to a spa or spa pool regardless of size, but shall not apply to natural swimming areas or natural areas of water on agricultural land.

Exemption. Wading pools are exempt from this regulation. A wading pool is a portable structure for holding water, or a body of standing water, basin or depression constructed for holding water with an interior depth of less than two feet.

CLINTON COUNTY COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION 28E AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into by and among the City of Camanche, Iowa; the City of Clinton, Iowa; the City of DeWitt, Iowa; the County of Clinton and the Clinton County Emergency Management Commission in Clinton, Iowa (collectively, the "parties").

- PURPOSE AND SCOPE: The purpose of this agreement is to establish and govern the
 operations of Clinton County Communications for joint emergency and non-emergency response
 communications services and facilities for law enforcement, fire, rescue, and emergency medical
 services in Clinton County, lowa pursuant to Chapter 28E of the lowa Code (2023), as amended.
- 2. **DURATION:** The duration of this Agreement shall be perpetual, unless terminated in the manner provided below.
- ENTITY CREATED: There is hereby created a separate legal entity to be known as the "Clinton County Communications Commission." The Commission is composed of the parties to this agreement.
- 4. **GOVERNANCE:** The Commission shall be responsible for governance.

5. COMMUNICATIONS COMMISION:

- a. The Communications Commission shall have five voting members, and hereafter will be referred to as Commissioners. The Commissioners will be the Mayor of the City of Camanche, the Mayor of the City of Clinton, the Mayor of the City of DeWitt, a member of the Clinton County Board of Supervisors and the Sheriff of Clinton County.
- b. Each Commissioner shall be an elected official and shall not be a member of the Technical Oversight Board (TOB).
- c. Each Commissioner shall have one vote.
- d. Unless otherwise provided herein, passage of any measure will require a quorum that shall consist of the members of the Commissioners.
- e. There shall be no term limits for the Commissioners.
- f. The Commissioners shall not be individually liable for the debts of the Commission.
- g. The Clinton County Communications Commission shall defend the Commissioners and shall save harmless and indemnify the Commissioners against any claim arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring within the scope of their duties.
- h. A Commissioner may appoint a proxy to represent the Commissioner at a Clinton County Communications Commission meeting, who shall have the same authority as the regular Commissioner. The proxy may be a member of the Technical Oversight Board (TOB), an elected official, an executive- level employee, or any designee the Commissioner deems

- appropriate. If the proxy is a member of the TOB, and meetings of the Board of Directors and TOB are being run concurrently, he or she may only vote on behalf of the TOB or Commission, not both.
- The Commission is responsible for the annual review and approval of the Communications Budget.
- j. The Commission shall elect a Chair and Vice Chair annually. The secretary for the Commission and Technical Oversight Board shall be the Communications Director, or his/her designee.

6. TECHNICAL OVERSIGHT BOARD:

- a. The Technical Oversight Board (TOB) is a sub-division of the Clinton County Communications Commission, separate from the Commissioners, and functions in the capacity as an advisory board to the Clinton County Communications Commission.
- b. The TOB shall consist of the Chief of Police of the City of Clinton, the Chief of Police of the City of Camanche, the Chief of Police of the City of DeWitt, Chief Deputy of the Clinton County Sheriff's Office, City of Clinton Fire Chief, City of Camanche Fire Chief, City of DeWitt Fire Chief and the Emergency Management Coordinator.
- c. Ex-Officio Members of the TOB shall be a member of the County EMS Association and the Clinton County Fire Chief's Association. Each Ex-Officio member will each hold a non-voting position on the TOB. The designated Ex-Officio member shall not be from an agency that currently holds a voting position on the TOB.
- d. Any recommendations by the TOB to the Communications Commission will require a quorum of the TOB membership.
- e. Each member of the TOB shall have one vote, with a simple majority of those present being needed to pass a motion.
- f. Members of the TOB may appoint a proxy representative, from their respective agency, to attend and vote in their place.
- g. The TOB shall provide recommendations to the Clinton County Communications Commission on operating procedures for Clinton County Communications.
- h. The TOB shall provide recommendations to the Commission on priorities and standards for the selection of a Communications Director and recommendations on policy governing the operation of computers, circuits and telecommunications terminals used to process store or transmit criminal history information, or other first responder information.
- i. The TOB shall select a Chair and Vice Chair for the Technical Oversight Board on an annual basis. The secretary for the Commission and Technical Oversight Board shall be the Communications Director, or his/her designee. Only TOB Members that serve their respective community in a full-time first responder capacity shall be eligible to become the Chair or Vice Chair.

- j. The Commission shall defend the TOB and shall save harmless and indemnify the TOB against any claim arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring within the scope of their duties.
- 7. **RULES:** This 28E will function as the rules governing the Clinton County Communications Commission. This 28E shall specify, at a minimum, the following information:
 - a. The list of parties to this Agreement.
 - b. The Commission's mission.
 - c. The Commission's powers and duties.
 - d. The manner for financing the Commission and its activities and maintaining a budget therefore.
 - e. The manner for acquiring, holding and disposing of property.
 - f. The manner for electing or appointing officers and the terms of office of the Directing Board.
 - g. The manner by which Commissioners may vote.
 - h. The manner for appointing, hiring, disciplining and terminating employees.
 - i. The rules for conducting meetings of the Commission.
 - j. Any other necessary and proper rules or procedure.
 - k. The rules, as adopted, shall be signed by each Commissioner.

8. COMMUNICATIONS DIRECTOR:

- a. The TOB may assist and provide recommendations to the Communications Commission on the hiring of a Communications Director. The Communications Commission shall have the final decision on the hiring of a Communications Director.
- b. The Communications Director shall manage the staff of Clinton County Communications and shall have authority on all personnel matters.
- c. Any disciplinary action that results in the suspension or termination of an employee of the Clinton County Communications, shall be reviewed and approved by the Clinton County Communications Commission Executive Committee, before being imposed.
- d. The appeal of any disciplinary action taken by the Communications Director shall follow the steps outlined in the Employee Policy Manual for Clinton County Communications.
- e. The Communications Director shall develop standard operating procedures for the communications center. Although accreditation is not required, recognized accreditation standards for communications centers, law enforcement and emergency services should be used as guides in developing the standard operating procedures.
- f. The Communications Commission shall defend the Communications Director and shall save harmless and indemnify the Communications Director against any claim arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring within the scope of his/her duties.

9. STAFF:

- a. In addition to the Communications Director, the Clinton County Communications Commission may employ such employees as it deems necessary to carry out the purpose of this Agreement and for which it has funding.
- b. The Communications Director and all Commission Employees shall comply with the political activity prohibitions set forth in Section 29C.16 of the Iowa Code (2023).
- c. The Communications Director and Commission Employees shall be considered employees of the Commission, and not of any party to this Agreement.
- d. The Communications Commission, with input from the Communications Director, may make changes to the personnel policies of the Commission, to include holidays, sick leave, vacation, and health benefits.
- e. The Communications Commission, with input from the Communications Director, may make changes to the rate of pay, only through collective bargaining.
- f. The Communications Commission may also choose to act independently or adopt existing personnel policies of any party to this Agreement in lieu of writing its own policies.

10. FINANCING:

- a. The Commission shall be financed through a county-wide supplemental levy (hereinafter "the Emergency Management Levy") as authorized by sections 29C. and 331.424(1)(a)(9) of the Iowa Code (2023), as amended.
- b. If the General Assembly amends the Iowa Code such that the Clinton County Communications Commission cannot be financed, in whole or in part, by the supplemental levy, the parties shall examine alternative financing options and amend this Agreement to provide for a new manner of financing the Commission.

11. BUDGET:

- a. The Commission shall develop and adopt a proposed budget of all expenses for its ensuing fiscal year (July 1 through June 30) in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 24 and section 29C.17 of the Iowa Code (2023).
- b. The Commission shall submit the proposed budget to the Clinton County Emergency Management Commission no later than January 31 of each calendar year.
- c. The budgeted funds shall be transferred from the Clinton County Emergency Management Commission to the Communications Commission semi annually.
- d. The Communications Commission shall be the fiscal authority, and the Chairperson of the Communications Commission shall be the certifying official.

12. **INVESTMENT OF FUNDS:** The Commission shall, when investing funds, comply with the provisions of sections 12B.10 through 12B.10C of the Iowa Code (2023) and other applicable law.

13. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT LEVY:

- a. The Clinton County Emergency Management Commission hereby delegates all its powers to the Communications Commission with respect to the provision of joint emergency response communications services and that portion of the Emergency Management Levy budgeted for Emergency Communications Services and has amended its bylaws accordingly.
- b. Clinton County Emergency Management Commission agrees to certify the Emergency Management Levy necessary to fund the operations of the Communications Commission as determined by the budget adopted by the Communications Commission.
- c. The Clinton County Emergency Management Commission shall submit to the Clinton County Board of Supervisors a budget that includes the budget adopted by the Communications Commission.
- d. The Clinton County Emergency Management Commission shall transfer to the Communications Commission that portion of the Emergency Management Levy budgeted for Emergency Communications Services.
- e. The Clinton County Emergency Management Commission acknowledges that it retains no independent authority over the Emergency Management Levy funds delegated herein.
- 14. **POWERS:** The Commission shall be a separate legal entity exercising public and essential governmental functions to provide for the public health, safety and welfare and shall have the following specific powers, including but not limited to:
 - a. To sue and be sued.
 - b. To acquire, hold, use and dispose of personal property for the purposes of the Commission.
 - c. To acquire by purchase, gift, lease or otherwise, real property and easements therein, necessary or useful and convenient for the operation of the Commission, subject to all liens thereon, if any, and to hold and use the same, and to dispose of property so acquired no longer necessary for the purposes of this Commission.
 - d. To construct, equip, furnish, operate and maintain a building for joint communications services and ancillary services consistent with the purpose of this Agreement.
 - e. To make and enforce bylaws or rules and regulations for the management and operation of its business and affairs and for the use, maintenance and operation of its facilities and any other of its properties, and to annul the same.

- f. To do and perform any acts and things authorized by Chapters 28E and 28F of the lowa Code (2023), as amended, by this Agreement, under, through or by means of its officers, agents and employees, or by contracts with any person or entity.
- g. To hire employees, fix their compensation, benefits, personnel rules and regulations, and terminate their employment.
- h. To accept grants, and to enter into contracts, leases, or other transactions with municipal, county, state or federal governmental entities.
- To enter into any and all contracts, execute any and all instruments, and do and perform any and all acts or things necessary, convenient or desirable for the purposes of the Commission.
- j. To contract with and compensate consultants for professional services including but not limited to architects, engineers, planners, lawyers, accountants, and all others found necessary or useful and convenient to the stated purposes of the Commission.
- k. To provide, consistent with Chapters 24, 28E, and 29C of the Iowa Code (2023), as amended, for a system of budgeting, accounting, auditing and reporting of all Commission funds and transactions.
- I. To make or cause to be made studies and surveys necessary or useful and convenient to carrying out the functions of the Commission.

15. MEETINGS/RECORDS:

- a. Communications Commission business shall be conducted in compliance with Chapters 21, 22, and 28E of the Iowa Code (2023), as amended.
- b. The Commission shall meet no less than quarterly. Additional meetings may be held at the discretion or recommendation of the Chair or Vice Chair of the Clinton County Communications Commission.
- 16. **AMENDMENT**: Terms of this Agreement may be amended only by a written agreement executed by four of the five Commissioners.
- 17. **ADDITION OF ENTITIES:** An entity may join the Communications Commission upon the vote of four of the five Commissioners, and this Agreement shall be amended accordingly.

18. WITHDRAWAL OF PARTIES:

- a. Withdrawal of a party shall terminate this Agreement.
- b. A party may withdraw after four of the five parties hold public hearings before their respective governing bodies with notice published as required by section 362.3 of the lowa Code (2023) and vote to approve the withdrawal at two meetings held at least thirty days apart.

19. TERMINATION/DISSOLUTION:

- a. This Agreement shall be terminated, and the Communications Commission dissolved, after four parties of the five parties hold public hearings before their respective governing bodies with notice published as required by section 362.3 of the lowa Code (2023), and vote to terminate at two meetings held at least thirty days apart.
- b. The effective date of the termination shall be 180 days following the second vote of the fourth party to approve termination.
- c. Termination shall not relieve parties of any financial obligation incurred before the effective termination date under the terms of this Agreement.
- d. The Commission shall not be dissolved when there remains any indebtedness incurred by the Commission.
- 20. Notwithstanding the provisions contained within paragraphs 18 &19 or any other provision of the agreement, the participating criminal justice agencies may terminate their participation at any time.
- 21. DISTRIBUTION OF PROPERTY: Upon termination of this Agreement and dissolution of the Commission, the parties agree to negotiate in good faith how the assets of the Communications Commission shall be distributed.
- 22. **NOTICES:** Notice is effective by ordinary mail addressed to:
 - City Clerk, City of Camanche, 818 7th Ave, Camanche, IA 52730.
 - Administrative Assistant, Clinton County Board of Supervisors, P.O. Box 2957, Clinton, IA 52733
 - City Clerk, City of Clinton, P.O. Box 2958, Clinton, IA 52733-2958.
 - City Clerk, City of DeWitt, P.O. Box 407, DeWitt, IA 52742

Administrative Assistant to the Sheriff, Clinton County Sheriff's Office 241 7th ave N, Clinton, IA, 52732

- 23. **EXISTING FACILITIES:** In carrying out the provisions of this Agreement and Chapter 29C of the lowa Code (2023), as amended, the parties further agree to utilize, to the maximum extent practicable, the services, equipment, supplies and facilities of existing departments, officers, and agencies of the state and of political subdivision at the respective levels of responsibility.
- 24. **INTERPRETATION AND ENFORCEMENT:** Interpretation and enforcement of the Agreement shall be in accordance with Chapter 28E of the Code of Iowa (2023), as amended, and statutes respecting the rights and responsibilities of political subdivisions.
- 25. **REPORTS TO SECRETARY OF STATE:** The Commission shall submit the initial report and biennial reports to the Secretary of State in accordance with section 28E.8 of the Iowa Code (2023), as amended.

- 26. **SEVERABILITY:** If a provision shall be finally declared void or illegal by any court or administrative agency having jurisdiction over the Commissioners and TOB to this Agreement, the entire Agreement shall not be void, but the remaining provisions shall continue in effect as nearly as possible in accordance with the original intent of the Commissioners and TOB.
- 27. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT:** This Agreement sets forth all of the covenants, promises, agreements, and conditions among the Commissioners and TOB concerning joint emergency response communications services, and there are no other covenants, promises, agreements or conditions, either oral or written, among them.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAMANCHE IOWA MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING TITLE 3 CHAPTER 10 SECTION 2 JUNK AND ABANDONED VEHICLES – DEFINITIONS AND TITLE 3 CHAPTER 10 SECTION 12 SUBSECTION 2 – EXCEPTIONS OF THE CAMANCHE CODE OF ORDINANCES

<u>Section 1. Purpose.</u> The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the Camanche Code of Ordinances for the purpose of further defining Junk Vehicles.

Section 2. Facts Found. The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa hereby makes the following findings of fact:

- A. The City of Camanche has an existing ordinance concerning junk vehicles
- B. The City of Camanche finds the existing definition of Junk Vehicles to be insufficient
- C. The City of Camanche seeks to manage the visibility of junk vehicles within its business districts and residential properties

Section 3. Amendment. The Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances for Chapter 3-10-2(4) is hereby amended to add the following:

- f. Any vehicle not capable of being driven from the place of its location under its own power without additional parts or repairs thereon
- g. Any vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer not equipped with the number of inflated tires necessary for its operation

The Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances Chapter 3-10-12 Subsection 2 - Exceptions is hereby replaced with the following:

- 2) A vehicle on the premises of a business enterprise operated in a district properly zoned therefor, as authorized under the Zoning Ordinance or restricted residence district of this City, when necessary to the operation of said business enterprise provided said vehicle is behind a minimum 6 (six) foot solid privacy fence or fully screened from public view
 - a) Any vehicle defined as a junk vehicle by this ordinance may be registered with the Camanche Police Department and may be outside of the above requirement for a period of no more than 90 calendar days

<u>Section 4. Repealer.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 5. Severability Clause.</u> If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the

Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

The City of Camanche is seeking statements of qualifications for engineering services for creating an overpass in the City covering a portion of the Canadian Pacific / Kansas City Southern rail.

PART ONE: SCOPE OF SERVICES

The City of Camanche (the "City") is soliciting qualification statements for engineering services to assist the City with projecting the feasibility and costs concerning the creation of an overpass within the City of Camanche to provide open passage over the Canadian Pacific / Kansas City Southern (CPKC) rail. - a. Describe Respondent's firm by providing its full legal name, date of establishment, type of entity and business expertise, short history, current ownership structure and any recent or materially significant proposed change in ownership.
- b. Describe any prior engagements in which Respondent's firm assisted a municipality or other local public body with lowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) projects. Respondent should include examples of work on similar projects as described in Part One. Respondent should provide a list of completed significant overpass construction projects completed in the last 5-10 years and related IDOT projects as well as federally funded Department of Transportation (DOT) projects. Respondent should provide the names, phone numbers, and emails of contact persons in the organizations for whom any projects referenced in this section were conducted. Respondent should include written references (letters or forms are acceptable) from previous clients attesting to the quality of work and compliance with performance schedules Respondent cites in this section.
- c. Describe the firm's current capacity to timely accomplish work for the City.
- d. Describe any issue the characteristics of which would be uniquely relevant in evaluating the experience of Respondent's firm in handling the proposed projects.
- e. Provide current information on professional errors and omissions coverage carried by Respondent's firm, including amount of coverage and name of insurance carrier.
- f. Provide evidence of adequate financial stability. The City reserves the right to request any additional information to assure itself of a Respondent's financial status.

3. Specialized Knowledge

Respondents should:

- a. Describe their knowledge and experience in the particular types of projects described herein.
- b. Describe their familiarity with the state and local grants and other funding sources.
- c. Describe their familiarity with submission and administration of IDOT, DOT and any other potential funding sources for such a project.

4. Personnel/Professional Qualifications

Respondents should:

a. Identify staff members (as applicable), in the job classifications of (1) Principal in Charge, (2) Project Engineer, (3) Senior Engineer, (4) Associate Engineers, assigned to act for Respondent's firm in key management and field positions providing the services described in Part One (Scope of Services), and the functions to be performed by each. b. Include resumes of each such staff member designated above, including name, position, education, and years and type of experience. Describe, for each such person, the projects relevant projects similar to what is contained in this RFQ on which they have worked. Provide the names and contact information of contact persons with the municipality with whom these staff members worked on such projects. c. Estimate the number of persons to be assigned to handling the City's projects, indicating the number working in Iowa and the number working elsewhere.

PART THREE: SELECTION CRITERIA

The City of Camanche shall evaluate each potential contractor based upon the following criteria:

- A. Professional qualifications necessary for satisfactory performance of required services;
- B. Specialized experience and technical competence in the type of work required;
- C. Current capacity to accomplish the work in a timely manner;
- D. Past performance on contracts with municipalities and other local public bodies in terms of cost control, quality of work, and compliance with performance schedules, including any City projects;
- E. Firm's location and local personnel who will respond to the City's road maintenance needs;
- F. Experience of the firm with other types of municipal, IDOT and DOT projects; and
- G. Reference from other clients attesting to firm's:
 - 1. Quality of work, and
 - 2. Compliance with performance schedules

The firm's submittals will be evaluated and scored. The top firms will be given oral interviews. As a result of the interviews, the City of Camanche will determine which firm will be selected to enter into contract negotiations. Unsuccessful firms will be notified as soon as possible.
