Under Unfinished Business, Mayor Pro Tem Bowman said Mayor Pruett asked for the 28E Agreement with Clinton County Communications to be Tabled until the next meeting.

Also under Unfinished Business, Mayor Pro Tem Bowman read the Second Reading of An Ordinance Amending the Camanche Code of Ordinances 3-10-2 Junk and Abandoned Vehicles and 3-10-12 Subsection 2 Exceptions, by Title Only.

Moved by Councilman Edens Second by Councilman Bowman to approve the Second Reading of An Ordinance Amending the Camanche Code of Ordinances 3-10-2 Junk and Abandoned Vehicles and 3-10-12 Subsection 2 Exceptions, by Title Only. On roll call — Ayes — Councilmembers Weller, Farrell, Klahn, Bowman, Edens. Nays — None.

Members of the Council decided to not Waive the Third Reading of or Adopt An Ordinance Amending the Camanche Code of Ordinances 3-10-2 Junk and Abandoned Vehicles and 3-10-12 Subsection 2 Exceptions at this meeting. These items will be on the September 16, 2025 Agenda.

Mayor Pro Tem Bowman read the First Reading of an Ordinance Amending Chapter 6-11-8 Subsection 4 – Swimming Pools, of the Camanche Code of Ordinances.

Moved by Councilman Edens, second by Councilman Weller to approve the First Reading of an Ordinance Amending Chapter 6-11-8 Subsection 4 – Swimming Pools, of the Camanche Code of Ordinances. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmembers Bowman, Edens, Farrell, Weller, Klahn. Nays – none.

City Administrator Kida led a discussion about the Civic Plus website upgrade proposal. He showed examples of websites they have done and asked if Council had an opportunity to look at LeClaire's website, which they had. With this upgrade, our website would have internal search features that are not available with our current website. People can also sign up for alerts that go out when the website is updated allowing for more citizen engagement. Civic Plus is a national company and they do a lot of municipal work. Councilman Bowman asked what the difference is between the standard and premium proposals; Kida recommends the standard, saying that we do not need the premium. Councilman Klahn said he studied the extra add-on fees and asked if we would be into these on top of the cost and Kida said we would not. Chief Schutte asked if this would be just for City Hall and Kida explained that it would be for all City departments. Councilman Bowman said he would like to see our website improved.

Moved by Councilman Bowman, second by Councilman Weller to approve the Civic Plus Website upgrade. On roll call – Ayes – Councilmembers Farrell, Bowman, Weller. Nays – Councilmembers Edens, Klahn.

Regarding the quote from Specialized Sealcoating for storm drain intakes and manhole surrounds in Murphy's subdivision, Public Works Director Pewe said he selected the 10 worst areas. The quote is \$500 each for a total of \$5,000.00. Councilman Edens asked if they have a written warranty. Pewe is not sure but is waiting for another quote from them and will have them provide what they have.

Moved by Councilman Klahn, second by Councilman Weller to Approve crack sealing quote from Specialized Sealcoating for storm drain intakes and manhole surrounds-Murphy's subdivision 10 @ \$500 each for a total of \$5,000.00. On roll call — all Ayes.

The approval of a quote from Specialized Sealcoating for sealcoating the parking area by the Splash Pad was tabled because the amount was not received in time for the meeting.

City Administrator Kida gave an End of Year Fund Balance presentation. He detailed the balances over several years for the General Fund, Road Use Fund, Water Fund, Sewer Fund, Solid Waste Fund and the Insurance Fund. He emphasized that the Fund Balance requirements set forth in our Fund Balance Policy are minimum balances, we need to treat them as floors. Council needs to focus on how we can achieve the General Fund Reserve and how we attain the Water Fund and Insurance Fund balances and how we can make the Sewer Fund positive again as we enter the budget planning time. Increased Water and Sewer rates have been discussed. There will be more detailed discussions about each of these departments in future meetings.

Councilman Bowman mentioned lightning monitors in the parks. Chief Schmitz reported that he met with Per Mar and Lectronics regarding the camera project. He said the 501c3 was

approved for the \$5,000 Lyondell grant plus an additional \$500 grant for community engagement. Schneider reminded everyone that election paperwork can be picked up at City Hall or obtained online at the Iowa Secretary of State website. Papers are due at City Hall by 5:00 p.m. on September 18, 2025.

Mayor Pro Tem Bowman asked for Public Comments. Susan Czer 1611 3rd Street spoke "to the Council, Mr. Kida and the good folks of Camanche about this bond referendum towards the new Library. People need to understand this is not and up down vote on the Library. Rather, you are voting for the referendum that will, in fact, partially pay for a Library. A referendum on the bond that we are talking about is a \$4.2 million bond and that would go towards a \$6, 7, 8 million Library which we don't know how much it is at this point in time. So we don't actually know the cost and want us to vote for a \$4.2 million+ bond and if that will fund a \$6, 7, 8 million Library partially. Mr. Kida says that he will apply for grants. We don't know if we would get them. We don't know how much they would be for. So that's kind of up in the air at the same time. So, in review, we vote for a \$4.2 million bond for a Library that we don't know how much it's going to cost, bringing in grants that we don't know if they will be received or how much they are for. So, we are actually saying that we need to vote for the bill before we know what's in the bill. And this is something like Nancy Pelosi-land. This is craziness. Uh, nobody in their right mind would or should vote for something like this. It's as if all common sense has left the room to even put this on the ballot". She said she has personally tried to talk to Mr. Kida, talk to you folks but can't take you on by herself, she can't do it by herself. She wants everyone to vote no. She said when we vote no, "we will put a stake in the heart of this Library project once and for all and send an incredible message to Mr. Kida and this Council". When Mayor Pro Tem Bowman noted her three minutes were up, she made a comment about having to listen to everyone else but only getting three minutes, despite this being clearly stated on every agenda. City Administrator Kida corrected her on the pronunciation of his name, as she has been saying it wrong each time she speaks at meetings. He also clarified that the referendum is for the permission from voters to borrow the money, not necessarily to do it. It is whether or not we have permission to borrow if all the other things fall into place. If the other things do not fall into place, we do not borrow the money.

Mark Forney 1439 18th Avenue said for 17th and 18th there needs to be some serious look at the road for some drainage. Kida encouraged him to talk to Gaylon about this. He asked what the junk vehicle ordinance is and mentioned a car next to him that has been on the grass and not moved for 9 months. Kida said he would talk to Mr. Forney after the meeting. Then Mr. Forney asked who takes care of the grass coming into Camanche. After some clarification, it was noted that the DOT mows it. He would like to see it cleaned up.

Mayor Pro Tem Bowman asked Council for requests for placement of matters on future agendas. There were none.

Mayor Pro Tem Bowman adjourned the meeting at 7:09 p.m.

FROM KLINT GINGERICH:

My suggestion is that we pause drilling at 1000, 1100, and 1200 long enough to get a good clear sample. Id hope that the sampling cost is covered by 3M/Camanche, and am not including that. I will gladly take the sample so as not to delay the process. I dont want to wait on them to show up each time. This will be an airlifted sample, not a test pumped sample. Possibly not quite as accurate, but it would show a trend. It shoule be more accurate than a packer test.

We would add 8500\$ for each time we stop and collect a sample. This does expect that there are not delays in waiting on the collector (why Id like to collect).

I am not sure if it will tell us alot, but given how you have one well that passes scrutiny and one that doesnt, Id really like to find some success here. I think this increases our odds. If the final test pumped sample (1300') proves high again, and if a shallower one didnt show the increase, we could backfill and try to change the source a bit.

Hope that makes sense.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAMANCHE IOWA MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING TITLE 3 CHAPTER 10 SECTION 2 JUNK AND ABANDONED VEHICLES – DEFINITIONS AND TITLE 3 CHAPTER 10 SECTION 12 – EXCEPTIONS SUBSECTION 1 AND SUBSECTION 2 OF THE CAMANCHE CODE OF ORDINANCES

<u>Section 1. Purpose.</u> The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the Camanche Code of Ordinances for the purpose of further defining Junk Vehicles.

Section 2. Facts Found. The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa hereby makes the following findings of fact:

- A. The City of Camanche has an existing ordinance concerning junk vehicles
- B. The City of Camanche finds the existing definition of Junk Vehicles to be insufficient
- C. The City of Camanche seeks to manage the visibility of Junk Vehicles within its business districts and residential properties

Section 3. Amendment. The Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances for Chapter 3-10-2(4) is hereby amended to add the following:

- f. Any vehicle not capable of being driven from the place of its location under its own power without additional parts or repairs thereon
- g. Any vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer not equipped with the number of inflated tires necessary for its operation

The Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances Chapter 3-10-12 - Exceptions Subsection 1 and Subsection 2 are hereby replaced with the following:

- 1) A vehicle in an enclosed building or a car cover manufactured for vehicles. For the purpose of this ordinance, tarps are not considered a car cover
 - 2) A vehicle on the premises of a business enterprise operated in a district properly zoned therefor, as authorized under the Zoning Ordinance or restricted residence district of this City, when necessary to the operation of said business enterprise provided said vehicle is behind a minimum 6 (six) foot solid privacy fence or a car cover manufactured for vehicles or fully screened from public view. For the purpose of this ordinance, tarps are not considered a car cover.
 - a) Any vehicle defined as a junk vehicle by this ordinance may be registered with the Camanche Police Department and may be outside of the above requirement for a period of no more than 90 calendar days in commercial areas where vehicle repair is the operation of the business. All other vehicles classified as a junk vehicle under this ordinance shall have no more than 72 hours of exception to this ordinance.

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6-11-8 SUBSECTION 4 OF THE CAMANCHE, IOWA CODE OF ORDINANCES SWIMMING POOLS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMANCHE, IOWA:

Section 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this ordinance is to amend Chapter 6-11-8 of the Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances.

Section 2. Facts Found. The City Council hereby makes the following findings of fact:

- 1) The City of Camanche has determined that Chapter 6-11-8 does not have a distinction between pools and storm water basins
- 2) Additional language is necessary for clarification

Section 3. <u>Amendment</u>. The Camanche, Iowa, Code of Ordinances 6-8-11 Subsection 4 is hereby amended as follows:

- 6-11-8 SWIMMING POOLS AND POOLS.
 - 4. This section shall also apply to a spa or spa pool regardless of size, but shall not apply to natural swimming areas, natural areas of water on agricultural land or storm water detention areas designed to dissipate storm water in a timeframe approved in submitted storm water site plans.

Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. <u>Severability Clause</u>. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 6. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final approval, passage, and publication as provided by law.

City of Camanche Sanitary Sewer Fund Operational Report


Fiscal Year 2012-2025

History of the Sewer System since 2012

- City of Camanche operates the Sanitary Sewer system as a business enterprise of the City
- It is considered a business operation by State Code
- Previously operated its own treatment facility
- Joined 28E with the City of Clinton in 2009 for a regional approach to treatment
 - Without this, the cost to expand and update the treatment facility would have been significant
- Treatment facility was converted to a lift station and force main operation
- Debt issued to fund the project without a mechanism to repay the debt
- Sewer Fund ended FY2016 negative for the first time
- FY2018 established a Debt Service Fee
- Repayment of previous meter purchase from Water Fund
 - The original purchase did not use water funds because the water fund was negative
- Frequent excess water fund transfers in the last few years have kept the fund positive

Sewer Expenses


- Salaries changed after 28E agreement
- Varied costs center around Maintenance and Repairs
- Most other expenses are consistent
- Staff has made adjustments in order to help the fund


Sewer Revenues

REVENUES VS. EXPENSES W/O DEBT SERVICE OR TRANSFERS





Summary

- The sewer fund is not solvent
- The continued fund transferring from the water fund does not address the true issue / not being able to transfer water funds means a negative sewer fund balance this year
- In its day to day operation it is break even IF there are no major repairs
- Although it funds some salaries, it does not fund percentages of people who provide service for the sewer operation
- Continued deficit spending will result in a lowering of bond rating
- If a debt is necessary, an actuary will assess the operation and dictate what the rate needs to be in order to take on the debt
- Continuing a marginal break even operation does not adequately fund operations or investment in future infrastructure needs






Executive Summary

- 1. **Proactive Enforcement Increases:** Traffic stops increased significantly by 42.86%, with related citations up by 25% and warnings/memos up by 62.58%, heightened traffic enforcement efforts before the start of the school year.
- 2. **Notable Arrests & Cases:** Several significant arrests were made, including narcotics-related charges, child endangerment, OWI incidents, and domestic assault. CAPD also assisted with multiple mutual aid and pursuit-related incidents.
- 3. **Community Engagement & Grant Success:** The department secured two grants a \$5,000 grant for upgrading the citywide camera system and a \$500 community engagement grant from Lyondell, supporting continued investment in public safety and outreach.




